1.4.2 Feedback Analysis and Action Taken Report of the University on feedback report 2020-21

The Feedback Analysis Committee of the institution designs and collects feedback from its stakeholders to monitor and evaluate its performance quality on curriculum and curriculum related issues. The feedback forms were collected from students, teachers, employers, alumni and professionals. Students who offered feedback were from different constituent colleges of MGUMST.

The feedback targets following different content for different stakeholders.

- For students, it addressed curriculum and its learning related issues in terms of quality, competence, skills and professionalism. This feedback also considers other issues like delivery of curriculum by teachers.
- For teachers, the feedback addressed issues like suitability the course and its need base, outcomes of the curriculum, relationship with course content and corresponding reference material, availability of reference materials in terms with curriculum, evaluation methods and curriculum delivery, etc.
- For employers, it addressed issues like general communication skills, developing solutions to real life problems, working in a team, creative challenges to challenges, organization skills, learning of new techniques, integration of technology for work as learnt through the curriculum.
- For alumni, it aimed for responses on adequateness of courses curriculum, sufficiency of syllabus content in context of current professional standards and curriculum design in context of development of self-directed learning and problem solving approach.
- For professionals, it targeted issues like necessity of additions and deletions in the curriculum in connection with theory and practical parts of the syllabus. The responses were also taken from them about the weightage of the syllabus in terms of marks distribution.

The feedback collected is analysed and sent to the respective authorities for the actions.

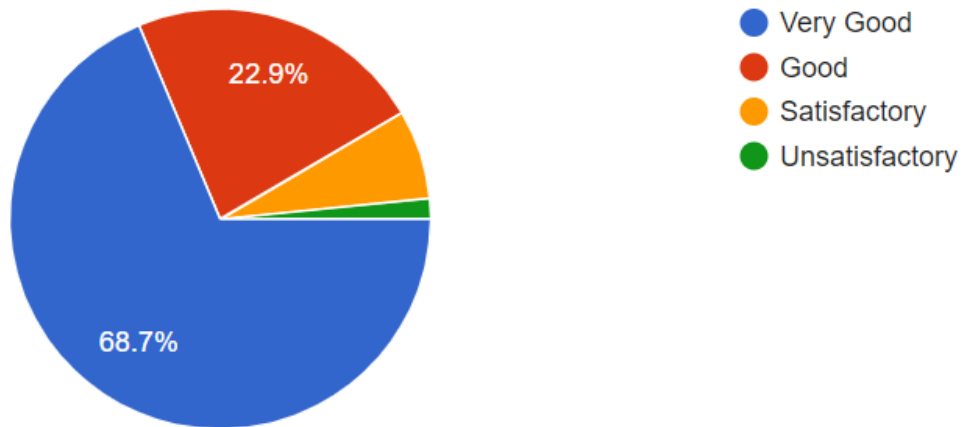
Out of total 761 responses, almost 68.7% students are satisfied with the depth of the syllabus. 66.5% believed that syllabus covered all aspects of curriculum including communication skills. 67.1% rated learning skills (in terms of Practical, Communication, Team work, Leadership, Research) as very good. 66.1 % rated availability of practical facilities as very good. 66.5% rated availability of clinical facilities as very good. 64 percent were satisfied with library reading room facility. 66.8% rated content and conduct of various internal examinations as very good. 63.5 % rated the feedback system related to your performance in internal examinations. 49.5% opined on extracurricular activities as excellent. Overall academic response was found to be 64.8%.

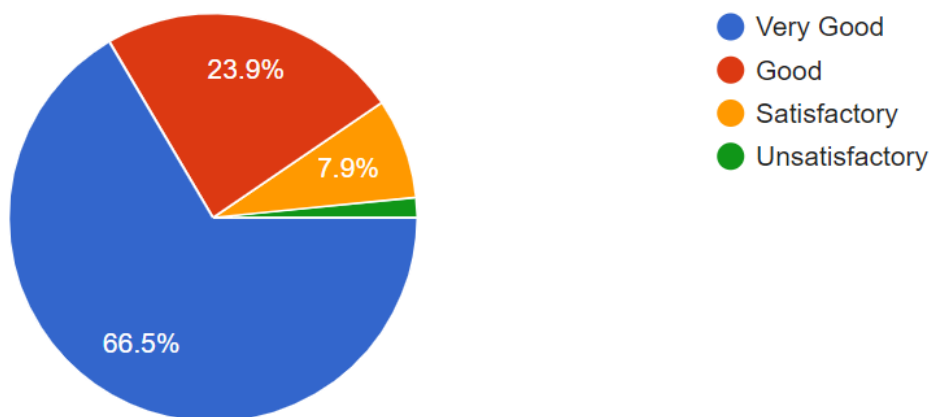

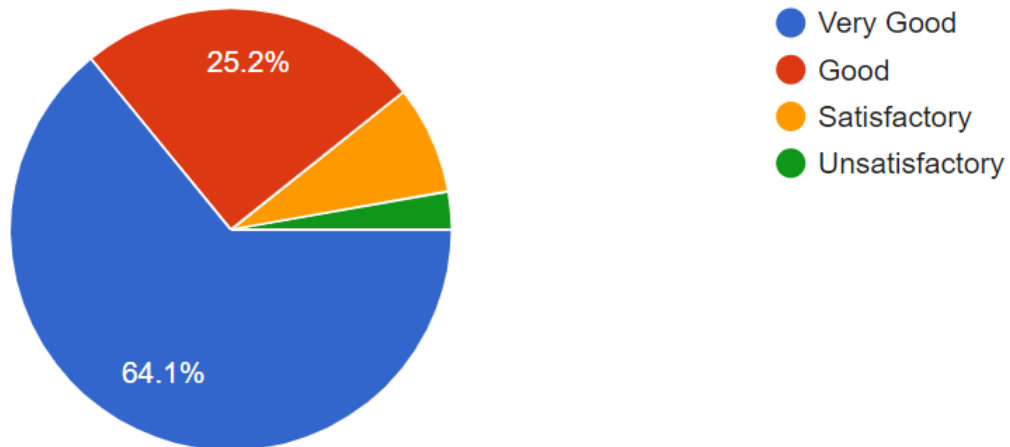
2. Depth of Course Content

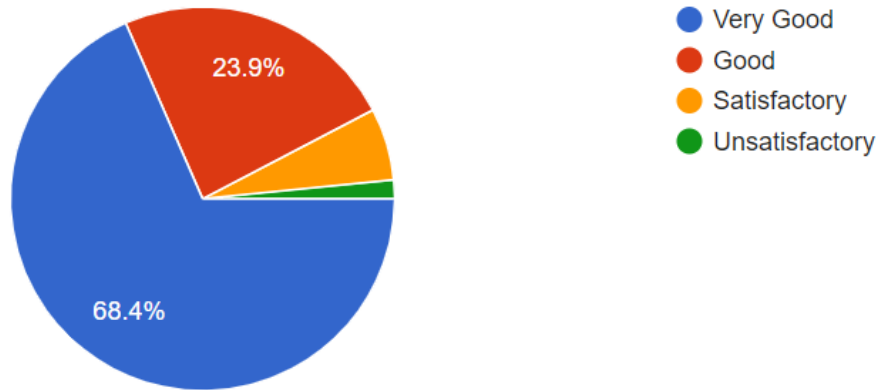
8. How will you rate your University theory exam paper content with respect to curriculum coverage

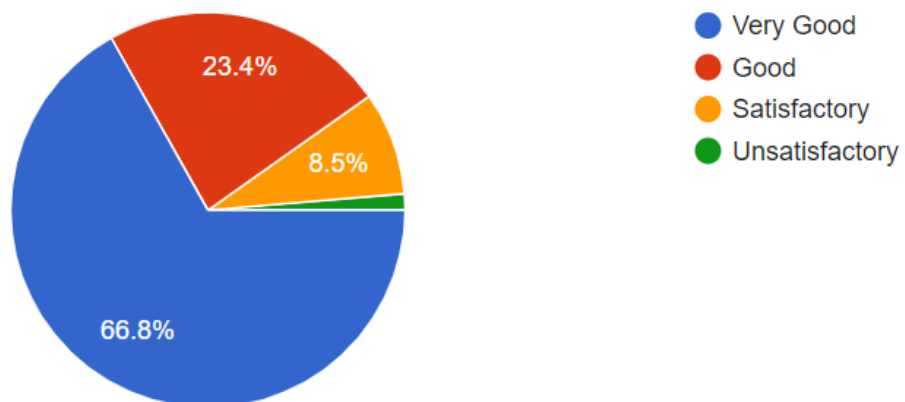
9. How will you rate your University practical exam content and conduct with respect to curriculum coverage

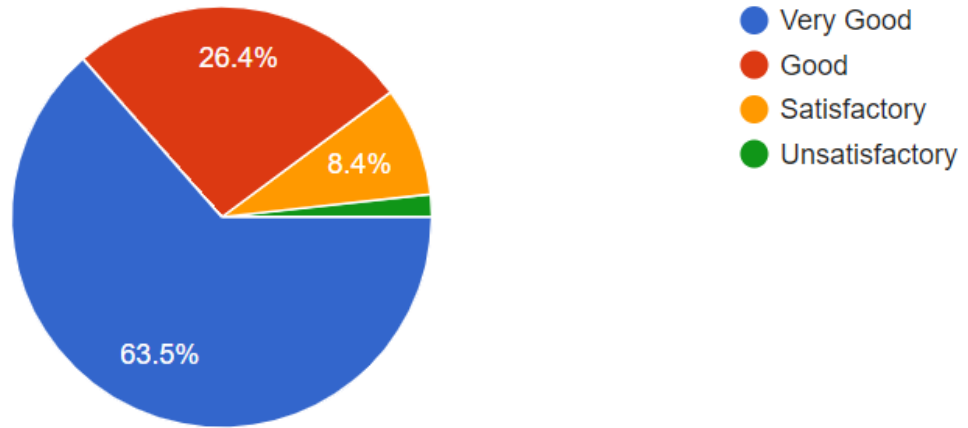
10. Opinion about content and conduct of various internal examinations

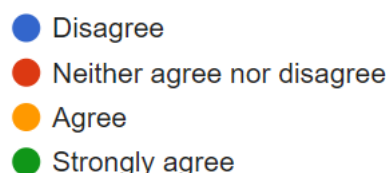
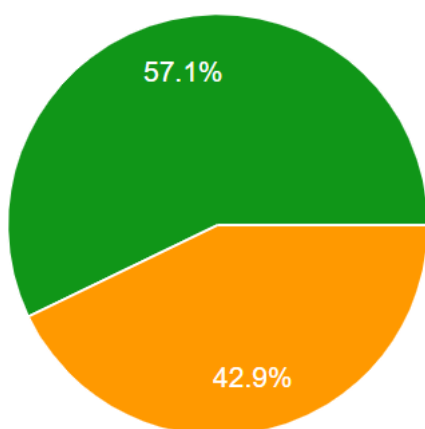
Faculty (Teacher) Feedback Analysis Report 2020-21

Out of total 106 responses, 57.1% of the teachers were satisfied with syllabus being suitable to the course and need based. 61.9% found objectives were clearly defined. Assessment was well correlated with syllabus and teaching learning methods. Freedom to adapt to newer strategies of teaching was found with 63.8%. 50.5% found relevant books in the library. 49.5% agreed that infrastructural facilities are sufficient. 55.2% found departmental environment conducive to teaching and research. 46.7% agreed that the University provides adequate and smooth support for projects and research facilities. It was found vertical and horizontal communication was appropriate. 55.2% found cordial work relationship with administrative staff.

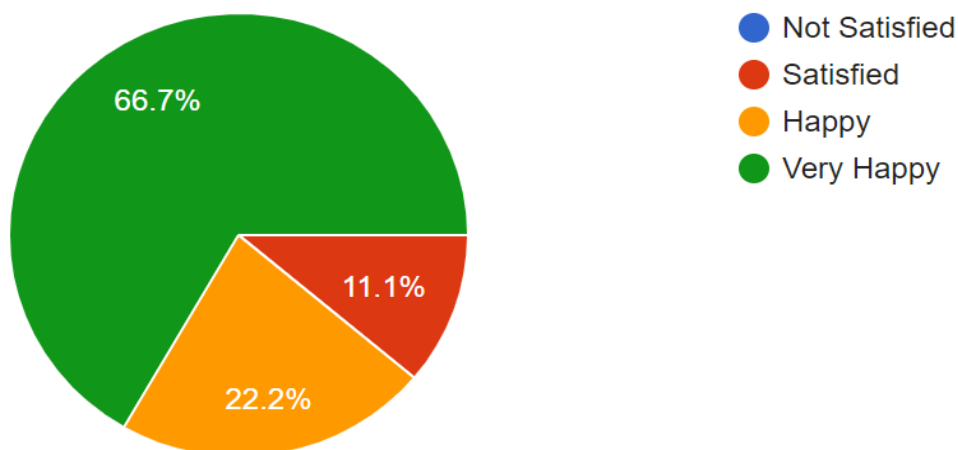
Employer Feedback Analysis Report 2020-21

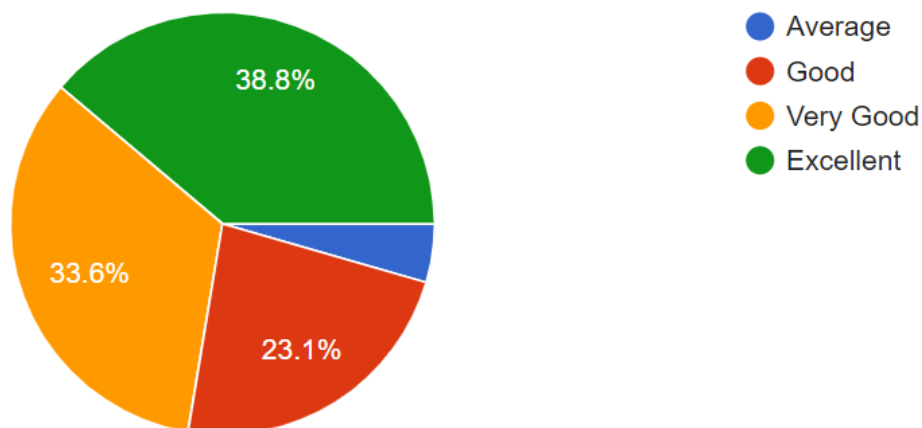
Alumni Feedback Analysis Report 2020-21

Out of total 135 responses, 38.8% graded adequateness of courses offered in the program as excellent. Sufficiency of syllabus content in context of development of technical skills was graded excellent by 38.5% alumni. 35.1% considered syllabus content suitable in context of current professional standards. Competence and support offered by teachers during the course was graded the best by 43.7% of alumni. Library, online resources & internet facilities offered by institute was rated by 40% as excellent. Overall Learning Experience in terms of relevance to real time experience was rated by 40.7% as the best. 42.9% rated Institute's support & contribution for overall development of students as excellent. Suggestions to improve the evidence based practice, practical demonstrations, home assignments with appreciation for pharmacology department was noted.

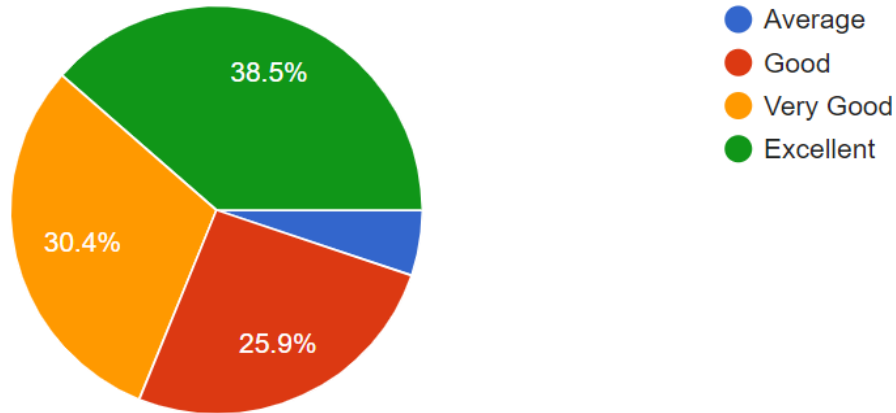

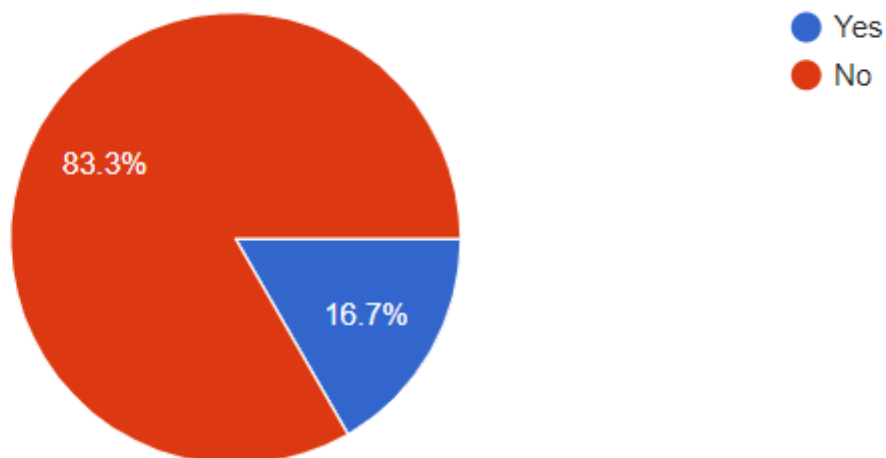
Professional Feedback Analysis Report 2020-21

Out of total 51 responses, 83.3% of responses opined that no change in theory syllabus was needed with suggestions to include recent advancements in the respective fields. Practical syllabus was found to be adequate with suggestions for rural postings and deletion of animal experiments from PG syllabus. 37.3% rated student performance in practicals and 42% in viva as very good. The consensus on overall exam conduction and arrangement for students was found to be very good.

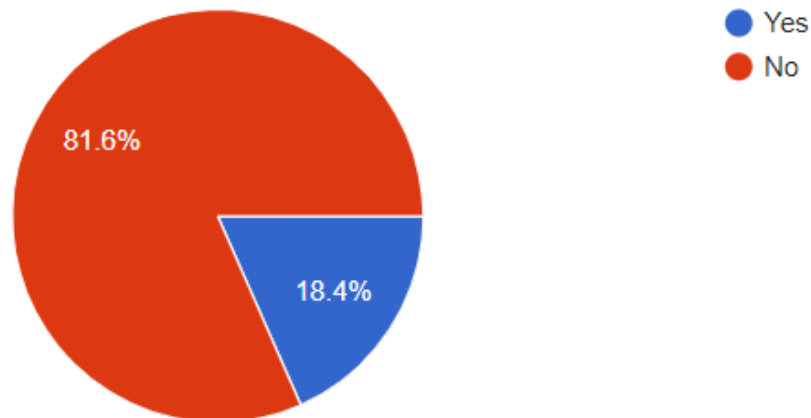

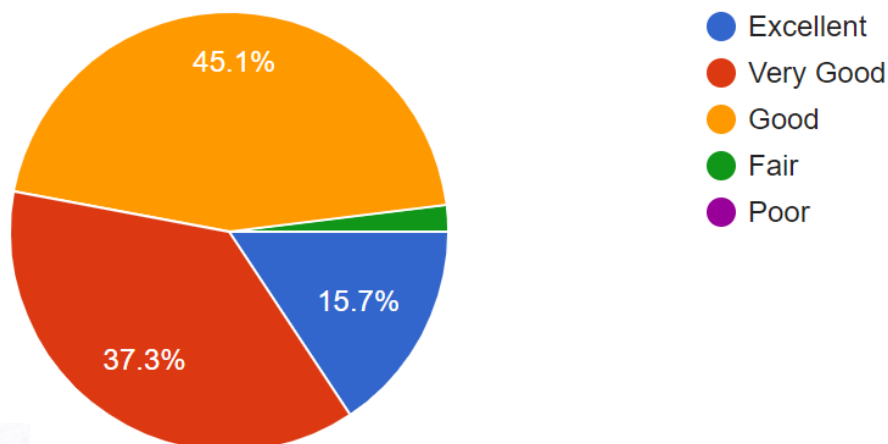

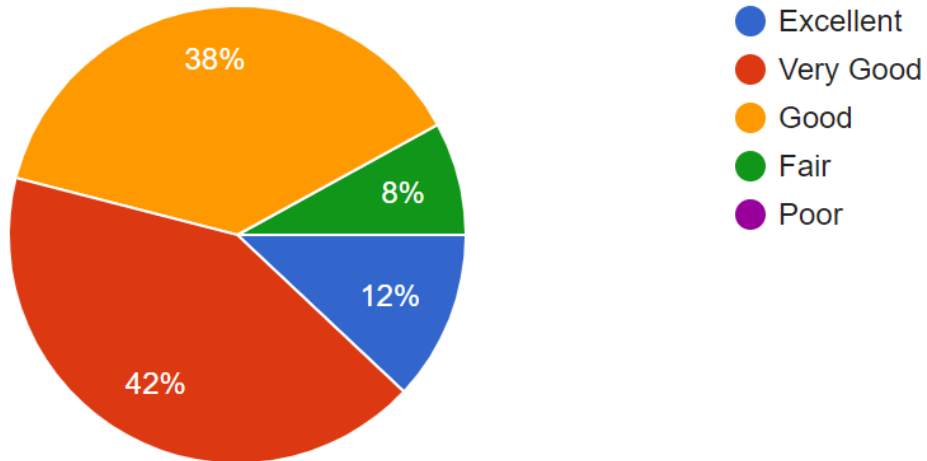
